

2023 Sunrise to Sunset Gimmick Rally

In the Jeopardy category "Tons of Fun" for \$200, the answer is: Over one hundred Porsche enthusiasts, representing eight different PCA Regions, competing for individual and regional glory, over three days in March. The correct question is: What was the 2023 Sunrise to Sunset Gimmick Rally?



After its prolonged absence, the Sunrise to Sunset Gimmick Rally was again held March 24-26. The rally began Friday night with the Blue Skies and Green Lights reception and dinner hosted by and held at Porsche Melbourne, and officially ended with the awards dinner at the Pier 22 restaurant in Bradenton on Saturday night. For those who did not get enough driving in the almost 400-mile round trip, there was even a bonus Suncoast Region autocross in St. Petersburg on Sunday morning!



Saturday morning began with a scrumptious breakfast (again provided by Porsche Melbourne) as we watched the sun rise from the oceanfront deck of the Crown Plaza hotel in Melbourne. Here the Rally Master (Brian Reinert) and his Evil Apprentices (David O'Neal and Mary Kirby) explained the rules and format of the drive. A new twist this year was the Jeopardy format. As we drove across the State, we were to determine the proper questions for the answers we were

given, which consisted of landmarks, street signs, etc. that we would pass along our way. This was not a race, but there was a maximum time allowed of six hours. There were four driving classes: novice, rally and expert would compete for top honors in their respective class, and touring would enjoy a non-competitive drive from coast to coast, all using the same turn-by-turn directions.



Cyndie and I were placed in the expert class since we finished third in the novice class in 2019, when this event was last held. We felt that we were out of our league considering the complexities that were added to the expert class, and that we don't turn around. The clues are in sequential order. If you find that you have skipped one, that means you missed it. Serious competitors will turn around when this happens to find what they missed. Not us. This policy helps maintain in-car harmony. At 9:00 am we began our journey in Cyndie's lava orange 2021 Cayenne GTS coupe.

Expert tip: read the entire list of clues before you start. We were a couple of hours down the road before we noticed that there were Double Jeopardy answers at the end of the list pertaining to things we had already passed! Augh! Novice mistake. We knew about this trick from our previous experience but forgot. Oh well, too late now. Lunch was on your own. We stopped at Lightsey's in Okeechobee where we met my brother and sister-in-law, Greg and Ann Kirk, who were experiencing their first rally in their 2007 Cayman S. Fortunately, they arrived ahead of us, secured our table, and ordered our food. Cyndie and I were in and out in about thirty minutes. Thank goodness for the quick lunch stop. We made it to the Peace River Park, a little east of Bradenton, to drop off our questions with only five minutes left to spare!

A host hotel in Bradenton for everyone to stay in was impossible to secure in the peak of the tourist season. Cyndie found an Airbnb home for us for Saturday night that was only about fifteen minutes away from the Pier 22 restaurant. We relaxed there until dinner with a cold beverage, and I took a nap. I was exhausted. Following the turn-by-turn directions while trying to find the next question for nearly 200 miles wore me out!


When we all met at the restaurant on Saturday night the room was buzzing. Everyone was discussing what they thought were the proper questions to the fifty answers that were provided. Ann Kirk said she felt like when, after a test in college, she would compare her answers to those of her classmates and then become worried that she failed the test.


Finally, the Rally Masters revealed all the proper questions. There was some heated debate about some of the questions. But one of the rules of the event is, "the Rally Master is always right." When all the arguing was over, the Space Coast Region rocked! In the novice class, Joe and Karen Pace finished 1st and Bob and Pat Greenwood finished 3rd. In the rally class, Scott and Becke Hansen finished 1st. In the expert class Cyndie and I finished 1st and Steve and Robin Hoffman finished 3rd.



The Sunchaser trophy is awarded to the Region that delivers the best overall performance and has been held by the Space Coast Region since last winning it back in 2019. The podium finishes of the Space Coast teams above contributed to our retention of the Sunchaser trophy with a total score of \$112,600 Rally Dollars compared to the second-place region (Suncoast) of \$52,600.

Cyndie and I were thrilled and amazed to win first place in the expert class and were proud to be part of the Space Coast Region's dominating rally team. Thank you to Shay Rowe and Porsche Melbourne for their deep support of our Club and of this event. Thank you to all those who contributed their time and talent into making the 2023 Sunrise to Sunset Gimmick Rally so much fun!

First Inaugural Grand Prix Autocross

The first of April was a no fooling Grand Prix Autocross event for Space Coasters. The idea of a once-a-year Grand Prix event that included an expanded course is something Ken Marshall and Ed Dedick from The American Muscle Car Museum (AMCM) discussed for the past few years. We were able to make it a reality with a safe course that used all the roads around the entire site. Not an easy thing to design a fast, fun, and safe course with buildings, ponds, fences, and solar panels surrounding most of the course. That said a course design was approved and 37 drivers got the unique opportunity to drive around the entire American Muscle Car Museum site.

For the first time the course started at the front of the AMCM parking lot, went counterclockwise around the main building to join with our normal course around the maintenance shop to the 1/8th mile and skid pad. The long course resulted in times ranging from 72 to over 100 seconds! Reflecting the once-a-year occasion for the Grand Prix, we provided breakfast and free lunch for all members in attendance. We also moved the scheduled KK to AMCM so lots of spectators came out to cheer their favorite driver, enjoy the competition and the food. Breakfast was our standard Panera fair while lunch was one of the best BBQ trucks around.

The Ladies class saw 6 competitors looking for top honors. Alexis Colgan brought home a decisive win in her GT4 with a 81.846 while Julie Wilson took second, driving her 992 Carrera S. Roger Duff took first in S02 classic 993/Boxster class. David Sierra took first over Chris














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Diary of a Porsche Princess

While my Prince often stays at the Residence Inn when visiting Sebring, our modest but comfortable lodgings for this longer stay were at Sebring Country Club Villas. Our quiet and well-provisioned two-bedroom duplex location was ideal – only 15 minutes East of the Raceway with minimal traffic.

On our first day, as my Prince pursued his need for Speed, I indulged my need for Spa. I received the Royal treatment at "Hammock Falls Spa", where I took delight in the services and ambiance. This cozy parlor of pampering just West of Sebring is a true gem! To begin, my technician expertly applied a Sea Salt Scrub followed by a warm Vichy Shower rinse. Next, I was soothed with a therapeutic massage before proceeding to a deluxe pedicure. I chose a teal polish that I felt would truly shine in my glass slippers.

That evening we reveled at a large and high-energy dining establishment quaintly called "The Watering Hole". We began with an appetizer order of homemade potato chips. This was followed by additional orders of the addictive chips, while we awaited our entrees. Finally, a tender and flavorful New York strip steak arrived, accompanied by unlimited salad and our selection of sides.

The next day, we ventured to the town of Lake Placid, just 20 minutes from our lodging. Lake Placid boasts not one, but two laudable distinctions: "The Caladium Capital of the World" and "The Town of Murals". Seeking to learn more, our first stop was the "Welcome Center" in the historic downtown area. Your Royal Highnesses were greeted graciously and offered a wide range of brochures describing regional tourist activities. We were disappointed to learn that the caladiums were sold out this year as Hurricane Ian had forced a shortage of the bulbs that grow colorful heart-shaped leaves. However, we caught the end of a film celebrating the city's murals and immediately set off on our trek to discover these municipal works of art.



We happened upon "The Blueberry Patch", a gift shop with its attached cafe "Morty & Edna's Craft Kitchen". This clever collocation allows Ladies to linger over the upscale merchandise while the gentlemen patiently tarry over a cup of coffee.

At midday we followed enticing aromas and found a restaurant in a small shopping strip. The creatively casual menu at "Glenda Jean's Country Kitchen" transcends the normal sandwich shop. I couldn't resist the "Southern Belle Burger" topped with pimento cheese and fried green tomatoes. Charming wrestled with the half-pound "Trailer Park Burger" smothered with chili, cheese, and fried onions. Drinks were served in huge goblets, and our attentive waitress even offered to provide a refill in a to-go cup.

The following day, we went on a pilgrimage an hour North to Lake Wales, rumored to be the historic center of the state's citrus industry. We stopped at "Florida's Natural Grove House Visitor's Center", located across the road from a monumental citrus cooperative juice manufacturing plant. At the Visitor's Center we enjoyed samples of citrus juices and educational exhibits about the development of orange farms and processing factories. Perusing their shop, we selected artisanal orange marmalade, orange-glazed popcorn, and an orange blossom scented soy candle for future hostess gifts.

In the heart of Lake Wales, we enjoyed lunch at "The Ranch Taproom and Coffeehouse". Stepping into the establishment, I admired the plush green upholstered booths and a beautiful mural promoting the grandeur of the area's cattle and citrus industries. Meanwhile, Prince Charming's attention was instantly captured by an enlarged TV image



of ESPN's Stephen A. Smith on the opposite wall. A most delightful young waitress persuaded us to replace the chicken on the Southwest Salad with pulled pork – an inspired concept. Noticing homemade pastries temptingly displayed on a counter, we decided to share a delicious Oatmeal Cream Pie, which was served with a hot mug of coffee approaching a quart in size.

A gentle stroll was in order following such a fine repast. Up the street, window displays enticed us to enter "G's Vintage Market". For a full hour we plundered this antique shop, which was rich in treasures including items we recognized from our distant childhoods, and mysterious finds which required explanation by the helpful proprietor.

Our final evening, we dined at "Chicane's Restaurant and Bar", located in the "Inn on the Lakes" in Sebring. This beautifully decorated dining room serenely overlooks the water. After a charming young waiter explained the evening's specials, we each chose a pasta dish – mine with chicken artichoke piccata sauce and his with shrimp scampi. The most extravagant portion of the meal was the dessert! In the "Chocolate Pile-Up", a chocolate brownie was enrobed with vanilla ice cream, mounds of whipped cream, swirls of syrup and toasted nuts. Overall, it was a most enjoyable dinner – we gave Chicane's our royal seal of approval.

Did I mention that I drove our traveling carriage on Sebring International Raceway during the "Parade Lap"? It is an experience I highly recommend. I gained a glimmer of understanding of what entices my Prince Charming to seek out Driver's Education events throughout the Kingdom.

Next time, I may bring my sportier coach, you know the one my Fairy Godmother made for me out of a pumpkin? See you there, my Ladies!

Wheels & Keels at the Moorings



Tech Session at PM - Tires

On May 6 Porsche Melbourne (PM) hosted a Tech Session with tires as the topic. Andy Kinner, PM Service Manager and Matt Jerzol, PM Parts Manager gave us a technical talk on our Porsche tires.



Here is are some of the topics discussed:

- A selection of worn tires were reviewed, some down to the cord. The wear markers were shown.
- It is important to check your tire pressures monthly.
- Your car should be treated to an alignment on a regular basis to avoid excess tire wear.
- PM sells tires at competitive prices and will match Tire Rack prices
- PM no longer uses nitrogen fill for tires. It is sometimes difficult to source nitrogen.
- It was stressed to get an alignment when getting new tires.
- The Porsche tire codes were discussed. You will want to use tires with Porsche code for best results on your car. The tires have been specifically designed for your model of Porsche.
- PM has the Hunter Road Force tire balancing machine as well as Hunter alignment rack.
- Tire availability was described as having 95% of tires in stock. Those that are not in stock can be gotten typically overnight.
- Tire age was discussed. The tires PM has in stock are typically less than two years old. Porsche recommends the tires on your car not be older than 6 years.

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- Joe the Porsche tech mentioned that many Porsche cars have negative camber especially on the rear tires. This accounts for some wear on inner edges.
- Andy mentioned that PM has three service advisers plus himself for your servicing needs.
- PM provides in house ceramic coating service for your wheels which makes them easier to keep clean.

Donna Edwards arranged for a nice breakfast and catered lunch. Many thanks to Porsche Melbourne for hosting the event.

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
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Second IMSA Podium for Filgueiras and McAleer in Detroit

Fans clamoring for an IMSA Michelin Pilot Challenge standalone weekend got get their wish with the Chevrolet Detroit Sports Car Classic on the streets of downtown Detroit. The last Michelin Pilot Challenge street race ran at Circuit Trois-Rivieres in 2010. The series in its former name and class iteration ran as part of the Quebec city's local grand prix weekend with a pair of split two-hour races for the Grand Sport (GS) and Street Tuner (ST) classes on a 10-turn, 1.521-mile track.

Cameron Lawrence earned the right to lead the field to green for Saturday's fourth round of the 2023 IMSA Michelin Pilot Challenge season, the Chevrolet Detroit Sports Car Classic in Qualifying. Lawrence lapped the 1.645-mile, nine-turn Detroit Street Course in 1 minute, 16.236 seconds and had nearly a one-second gap to the field before CBW Racing's Eric Filgueiras uncorked a lap within 0.150 of a second. That earned Filgueiras second Qualifying position in the No. 28 RS1 Porsche 718 Cayman GT4 RS CS he shares with Stevan McAleer.

Saturday's Chevrolet Detroit Sports Car Classic was won by Canadian Daniel Morad in the shadow of his home country in the fourth round of the IMSA Michelin Pilot Challenge season. Morad and Bryce Ward shared the No. 57 Winward Racing Mercedes-AMG GT GT4. Morad's relentless attack on a restart and eventual overtake secured



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the victory in the Grand Sport (GS) class-only, 100-minute race. It is both drivers' first victory in Michelin Pilot Challenge competition.

The No. 28 car, started by Eric Filgueiras, went for a fuel-only stop and swapped the car to Stevan McAleer. Meanwhile, the No. 95 car, started on pole by Cameron Lawrence, matched the strategy and flipped over to Robert Megennis after leading the opening 28 laps. It was there the complexion – and visuals – of the race changed. Megennis tried to lap a slower competitor but drove into the No. 19 van der Steur Aston Martin Vantage GT4. The momentum carried his BMW up and over the Aston Martin in a spectacular incident. Megennis' car hit the top of the tire barriers before he continued onto the pit lane, while van der Steur's car was significantly impacted on the driver's side and roof of the car. Both drivers made it back to pit lane.

The resulting full-course caution shuffled the order as a handful of cars had not yet pitted and subsequently lost track position when they did stop. The race resumed with McAleer cycled to the front ahead of Marc Miller in the debuting No. 78 Thaze Competition by MC Squared Mercedes-AMG GT GT4 and Morad third in the No. 57 Winward Mercedes.

While Morad began to stretch his gap in front, McAleer put on a defensive driving clinic behind him to keep a bevy of cars in his rearview mirror. Despite multiple attempts, Miller was never able to get past McAleer. McAleer and Filgueiras finished second with Miller and Michael Di Meo completing a dream debut for Birmingham, Michigan-based Thaze Competition, finishing on the podium in both the team's and Miller's home race.

The 2nd place for the RS1 duo moves them to to 2nd in the championship standings in just three races after beginning the year with a DNF during the opening round at Daytona International Speedway in January.

The Michelin Pilot Challenge resumes with both the GS and Touring Car (TCR) classes back in action at Watkins Glen International on Saturday, June 24.

Historic Sportscar Racing at Sebring International Raceway

On the beautiful weekend of March 24 to 26 Sebring International Raceway hosted the HSR "Spring Fling" race event, HSR's first race of the year. It was a crowded event with lots of participants in all classes this year on the legendary 3.74-mile Sebring International Raceway circuit.



Historic Sportscar Racing, now owned by IMSA, has a Five-Years of Age Rule. A particular Make & Model must have been first built and raced at least five (5) years prior to the start of the current year to qualify for one of the HSR classes. Once the first year of that Make & Model meets the five-year point, all identical later cars of that series are eligible. For 2023, the eligibility year is 2018. Post 2018 cars are allowed to race as Exhibition or X-class but are not eligible for annual points and awards.

Friday was qualifying runs for all the HSR Classes for drivers on a mission to get a good starting position for the races. The Historic Race has two Sprint Races as well as an Enduro Race for the weekend. The Sprint races are 8 laps long, the Enduro is a one-hour race, with a mandatory 5-minute pit stop, which allows each car the option of having a co-driver for the second half of the Enduro.

Our own Scott Kee was an avid participant and he and Eric Zita were co-drivers in the Enduro. The Kee/Zitza Team placed an acceptable 3rd in Class in the Enduro Race and Scott placed 3rd in Class in both Sprint Races with our 2016 Porsche GT-4 ClubSport. (#351)

It was a fun event as always, and there were a few Space Coasters on hand to congratulate Scott and Eric on their win.





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Stars, Cars and Pinot Noirs An Outer Space Experience

Over a year ago, we began planning a special event that had never been done before. It involved bringing 3 car clubs together for a common cause and it would be big. The Classic Car Club of America (CCCA) had a National Caravan starting in Titusville, FL and traveling across the state. Destination, Ocala and then returning a week later to Titusville after completing over 750 miles touring Florida sites. Its purpose was to raise funds for the Education Foundation of the Classic Car Club of America. The CCCA is made up of foreign and domestic motor cars built between 1915 and 1948. They include such makers as Auburn, Cadillac, Packard, and Rolls Royce to name just a few. Having the final dinner for the Caravan under the Space Shuttle Atlantis became an important part of the overall event. Phone calls were made, and contracts signed by the CCCA in 2022 to host the event on April 22, 2023!

The idea of inviting the Space Coast Porsche Club to attend, was presented to President Robin Hoffman. She responded "let's do it" and specifically liked the idea of bringing different car clubs together as a group to do an event on a large scale. Porsche Club member Joe Radosky, who was also a Ferrari Club member, suggested I contact the Ferrari Club in Orlando. Suddenly, we had 3 car clubs all promoting this exciting event. Would it work? We did not know for sure except that, whatever the results, it would be in support of the Education Foundation of the CCCA. This non-profit was created for the sole purpose of educating young people on the preservation and education of classic automobiles. Which if you think about it, Porsche and Ferrari cars of today are becoming the Classic Cars of the future.

At 6:00 pm sharp you could hear the exhaust of 4-, 6-, 8- and 12-cylinder cars, some with super chargers including some built in the 1930's & newer were parked outside the front entrance of the Kennedy Space Center (KSC). Owners enjoyed seeing the massive line-up of cars spanning over 106 years! CCCA volunteers began providing needed credentials at check-in. Many did not realize that because KSC is a working Space facility, everyone would be required to go through security and be staged as a group in the beautiful Rocket Garden just inside the KSC complex. It also became the perfect time for photographer Robin Hofmann to capture all 217 of us around the base of the Mercury-Redstone, Mercury Atlas and other historic rockets that first put Americans and satellites in space!

Then we were escorted to the Atlantis building. Approaching the building, you see the full-scale red external tank and two white solid rocket boosters reaching 184 ft into the sky. It is dramatic. Once inside, the introduction video tells a compelling story of the Shuttle Program. It focuses on its people, its successes and failures, including the key role it played in building the International Space Station as well as the launch and repair of the Hubble Space Telescope.

The video leads to a dramatic conclusion as the screen lifts and there is the Atlantis Space Shuttle directly in front of you. It makes you feel so proud to see this vehicle in person. It has completed 33 Missions and spent 307 days in space. It circulated some 4,828 orbits around the earth and total mileage for Atlantis' travels came to 125,935,769 miles.

Pinot Noir and cocktails were served along with hors d'oeuvres on the second level where guests could begin to explore over 50 interactive exhibits throughout the building.



Walking down to the first floor you could see the tables below for the evening festivities. Introductions of the leaders of the three car clubs were made. Dinner was served buffet style and the food was good and plentiful. Musical entertainment was provided by Johnny Live and dancing took place. Speakers for the evening included Jim Cowan President, CCCA Education Foundation as Emcee along with President Rick Svetkoff and Vice President Tim Franta of Starfighters International. Starfighters work closely with NASA and the space program testing equipment at high altitudes. A silent auction was conducted and over \$15,000 was raised for the Education Foundation!







It proved to be a great evening with all car club members and guests meeting new friends and enjoying each other's company, all the while supporting a great cause and learning a lot about space exploration.



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
Drive to the Brumos Collection

First a little Brumos history: Hubert Brundage established Brundage Motors in Jacksonville, Florida in 1953 and became a Volkswagen importer. Communication via Telex systems was commonly used back then, so Brundage Motors was shortened to Brumos. In 1958 they became the Porsche importer for the entire southeastern US and in 1959 they formally established their Porsche dealership. Peter Greg, an avid racer, acquired Brumos from the Brundage family in 1964 and in 1969 teamed up with then twenty-one-year-old Hurley Haywood. Hurley campaigned a Brumos Porsche in seventeen 24 Hours of Daytona races from 1971 to 2012, including a first in class finish in 1972 in a 911S and four overall first place finishes in 1972, 1973 and 1975 in a 911 Carrera RSR and in 1979 in a 935.

The Brumos Porsche dealership was sold in 2018, but you can still see some of these famous cars and more at the Brumos Collection in a beautiful facility located in Jacksonville. So, that's what eighty-six fellow Space Coasters did on Saturday, June 3rd. Thanks go to Steve Tarr for working out the logistics of how to mobilize 50+ cars, spread from Vero Beach to Daytona, to all arrive at the Brumos Collection at 1:00 with a lunch stop along the way. Well done, Steve!

Once entering the museum, we first encountered The Forerunners that contained examples of cars that set the stage for racing and automobile innovations that we know today. Creations by Peugeot, Duesenberg and Bugatti were on display together with electronic kiosks that displayed the story behind each automobile, a photo gallery, and its specifications. There were no ropes or barriers between





you and the cars. You could nerd-out at each one if you wanted to, reading every page on every kiosk, and exploring every detail of every car. So, I did.

Around the corner was the Porsche display. It was fabulous to stand right next to and admire the legendary cars raced by Hurley Haywood and others like the 1972 911S, the 1973 Carrera RSR, the 908 and 917. All these cars still run. They are currently being prepared to compete at the Rennsport Reunion to be held at Laguna Seca in Monterey, California this September. Cyndie and I will be attending this event for our first time. I can't wait to see and hear these machines at speed on that famous track.

I had heard about the Brumos Collection for years but had never seen it. I am so glad I made the trip.















New Porsche 917 in its Early Days

Back in 2001 I had the privilege of working for Porsche Motorsports North America (PMNA), at the old location in Santa Ana, CA. One summer afternoon a car transporter backed into the parking lot and prepared to unload a vehicle. This was unusual because at the time we predominantly just worked on Porsche race motors that were crated and shipped to us and we rarely dealt with actual vehicles at the shop. Everyone from the shop gathered around and helped unload the vehicle with extreme carefulness. My fascination was multiplied as we rolled the vehicle out from the transporter and I saw 917/30 003 stamped on the chassis. The boss said we have a special project and our task is to completely refresh the 917 and to bring it back to the same racing condition it was in the 1970s.


We immediately embarked on the task and spent the next few weeks completely disassembling the car. We took pictures, drew diagrams and documented each step of the disassembly. Every nut, bolt, wire, panel, etc... was removed from the chassis. We finally had the chassis down to a bare bones aluminum tube space frame. All of the chassis welds were redone, all anodized members were re-anodized and every part was cleaned with extreme precision after spending a good deal of time inspecting the parts for defects. Ironically, we spent the least amount of time on the engine because the 12 cylinder twin turbo had held up remarkably well and was in very good condition. The bodywork was sent off to a professional painter to freshen up the infamous Sunoco/Penske/Donahue colors.



Fast forwarding a few weeks, we get 003 completely reassembled and we all had a memorable moment when we fired up the Beasty. The sounds of a 917, even at idle, are remarkable. Before releasing the car we had one more critical step. We had to "dial in" the car which required the car to be driven on a racetrack. We loaded 003 into an enclosed trailer early one morning and headed to Willow Springs Raceway. Upon arrival and unloading we managed to attract some onlookers, like everybody who was at the track that day. Onlookers were enamored and one guy proclaimed, "I never would have guessed a 917/30 was going to show up at Willow Springs today." After some preparations, 003 was ready for the rounds. Professional driver Kort Wagner was asked to take on the task

of driving as we dialed in the car. He started off nursing the car

around the track and coming in every lap to provide feedback and



allowing us to make tweaks. The turbo boost setting was given a lot of attention because Alwin Springer, Director of PMNA, wanted to ensure there was boost, but not too much. After several laps the car was up to speed and we had completed our objectives. When Kort got out of the cockpit and took off his helmet he exclaimed, "Nothing gets you to the next corner faster than this car!"

We got the car back to the shop and spent the next few days on the finishing touches. This included close examination of old photographs to get graphics as close to their original placement as possible. The day came when we had finished our work and the transporter came to the shop to pick up 003. He said it had a plane to catch so it would make it over the pond in time for the 2001 Goodwood Festival of Speed, which was the impetus for the owner to have this extensive work done and it also defined our completion date. We sent it off and went back to work on some less captivating race engines. A few days later we got word 003 was still at LAX! There was some SNAFU, possibly paperwork, and the car never made it on the plane. The bad news is it missed Goodwood in 2001, but hey... when you own 003 in its glory state, there is still a silver lining.

Ray: Today's guest is Jay McGrath with his white 1996 Carrera 4S. It's our featured cover image. Tell me Jay, where did you find this beautiful car?

Jay: Well, this car was always priced out of my reach, so what I would do is I would buy an affordable Porsche, make some money on it, buy another, and sell that. I would keep on increasing my profit margin each time. Kept doing this until I saved enough money to buy this car. I searched the entire United States for this 4S. This is the first year in 1996, where they came out with the 4S which was the wide-body version. This car is a turbo without the turbo, so it has the turbo brakes, the turbo suspension, and the Aero kit.

Ray: I was going to ask you about the tail. I wanted to know if that was a stock item that came from the factory.

Jay: It came like that from the factory, they only made one thousand ninety-one of these C4s in the United States, and only about 10% of them that were made had the Aero kit, which was the most expensive option you could get at the time.

Ray: I mean, it's awesome! So, how often do you take this out to drive?

Jay: Only when the days are perfect and it's not raining. I hardly drive it. I've had the car for four years and put less than 1000 miles on the car each year.

Ray: So, is this a metallic white?

Jay: No, it's called Grand Prix white. It was a standard color that year. It has stock wheels, stock tires, and Turbo Wheels. Although not seen in these pictures, this car has a carbon fiber shifter and the brake handle. It also has a sound package as well. This was the first year they came out with the Carrera 4S.

Ray: How long have you been a Porsche guy? *Jay:* In 1977 I bought a yellow 1971 Porsche 911s. That was my first Porsche. So I eventually ended up selling the car, because I was in the Navy, so it was difficult to keep the car because I was moving around so much. So, it wasn't



until the 1990s where I bought a 1986 Porsche again and started my Porsche life over again.

Ray: So how many Porsches do you currently own?

Jay: I have two, this one and a 2017 C4s convertible. The color is Carmine red.

Ray: So, any plans for an upgrade, any point? *Jay:* No, I'm in the middle of changing homes right now, so it's kind of difficult.

Ray: Tell me about your personal life. *Jay:* I spent 27 years in the Navy and nuclear power program, submarine service, and

after I retired, I went to the civilian nuclear power industry and ended up working for Westinghouse where I was the senior lead start test engineer on the first AP1000 nuclear power plant ever made in China. I spent five years in China.

A big thank you to Shay Rowe and Porsche Melbourne for treating us to such a fun celebration.













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

According to the press release about the movie – "Transformers: Rise of the Beasts and Mirage, the Porsche 911 Carrera RS 3.8,



The Carons and the Bumblebee

I had the pleasure of sitting down over breakfast with a wonderful couple, Jerry and Betty Caron who have been members of PCA for 48 years!



Their background is very interesting. We discussed how they met, earned a living, and became fans of Porsche cars. Jerry and Betty were high school sweethearts in Sandwich, MA and got married that September after graduation. Jerry was working for his dad who was an electrical contractor. Betty was a vocalist. She grew up as a child in a musical family and would sing at community events. Betty told me, "Jerry was a shower singer." At first, I did not know what she meant until she said, "you know - likes to sing while taking a shower." We all laughed. Betty gave Jerry his first guitar as a Christmas present and he learned to play on his own. They began singing together and performed under the name "Two's Country." One day a representative from a recording studio in Nashville, Tennessee approached them and said that he had been hearing about these two musicians in Massachusetts and wanted to meet them for himself. He gave them his card and told them if they ever were interested in coming to Nashville and recording their music to look him up. Months later they made the trip and after 20 years in the country music business along with 3 CD's and 4 Top 100 Country Hits they retired. Jerry kept the electrical contracting business all the while Betty was bringing up their son and two daughters. So, they were busy people!

What about the Porsche cars, you ask? That is another great story in itself. Jerry tells me he was driving by the Mercedes/Porsche dealer on the Cape one day and sees this 1966 912 sitting on the lot. He said that when he took it for a test drive there seemed to be some issues with the motor. Jerry had owned VW's and as someone who understood mechanical issues and motors, told the dealer that he would buy the car if they would secure and pay for the parts needed. The dealer agreed and the deal was struck. Shortly after he had it running to his satisfaction the dealer offered to buy the car back for another customer, and Jerry rolled out of the showroom with a new 1969 911T!

The best story I think is the 1974 914 LE Bumblebee that he saw a few years earlier being delivered to the Porsche dealer that was available. It was not, however, in pristine condition. He said he paid \$2900 and knew it needed work. There was no time, however, to work on it as he had an electrical contracting business to run, country music gigs on the calendar and a family to raise.



Time passes and they moved to the Daytona Beach, FL area after Jerry retires in 2002. Over the years they had been taking part in Porsche Club activities in the New England Region and won a lot of trophies with the yellow 914.

Once in Florida they became part of the Space Coast Region. During Space Coast Region Club activities, Jerry met Chris Holman and Lou Verdiales who also enjoyed working on Porsche cars. In the fall of 2018, Jerry committed to getting the Bumblebee back on the road after 40 years! Chris and Lou under the keen direction of Jerry all worked together to get the Bumblebee in shape. The plan was to finish the car and drive the 914 LE to Amelia Island for the Werks Reunion in 2020. It was a home run for the 914 and for Jerry and Betty! Porsche fans really enjoyed seeing this rare car at Amelia Island and Jerry indicated he enjoyed meeting those who admired the car and asked questions about it. Just for the record this Porsche enthusiast has had a good number of Porsche cars that included: 1966 912; 1999 911; 1971 914; 1974 914; 1999 986; (2) 1966 912's, and a 1976 914 that he lost when the garage flooded.





So, if you are at the Space Coast Region Northern Kaffeeklatsch on the 3rd Sunday of the month, and the sun is shining and it is a beautiful day for a drive, you just might want to take a trip to see Jerry and Betty and get a peek at a Sunflower Yellow/Black Bumblebee which is one of only two color combinations in those 914 1000 LE models for 1974. You will not find a nicer couple and we in the Space Coast Region salute them for being members of PCA for 48 years and married for 68 years! Congratulations you two!
