Zonefest at Sea 2022Proof positive it's not just the cars...it's the people

My wife Becke and I have just returned from the first ever Zonefest at Sea, and we're happy to report that the event exceeded every expectation we had of the PCA, Zonefest events and cruises in general. We loved every single minute of it thanks to the great work by the organizers and the officers and crew of the Regal Princess.

And on that note, in the event you grow weary of reading my article, I'm going to thank a few people right up front. First of all, Leslie Sikorski, Zone 12 Representative, David Bankston, incoming President of Everglades Region, and Vu Nguyen, PCA Executive Director, who worked closely with the Princess Team, together creating this first ever Zonefest at Sea. Special thanks to Tom Gorsuch, President of the PCA, and all the other national leaders and team members for supporting this fantastic event. And of course, I can't say enough good things about Regal Princess Captain Paolo Arrigo and his friendly and attentive officers and crew. It's not just the cars...it's the people.

Becke and I have been on several cruises before. And, the whole embarkation process can be a bit daunting, with opportunities for delays and problems at every turn. But not with the PCA Zonefest at Sea and the Regal Princess. Our December 10th embarkation process was flawless, with helpful PCA signage at every turn, an incredibly efficient dedicated PCA check-in process and team, and a private preboarding lounge just for us. And right on schedule, the great times began for 600 PCA members when we all boarded the Regal Princess and were greeted by the ship's officers. Ahoy Mateys!

On the afternoon of December 10th, the Regal Princess horn, playing the theme from the Love Boat, announced our departure from Fort Lauderdale with 2 days at sea ahead of us enroute to St. Maarten. Let the excitement and camaraderie begin!

Our week full of special PCA activities got rolling with a welcome reception and Concourse at Sea check-in. In the end, PCA members entered 118 incredible 1:18 scale models for judging. The Regal Princess crew provided us with prominent display space for everyone aboard the ship to enjoy throughout the week...not just PCA members. I had many non-PCA passengers comment on the "beautiful cars" ... with many of them, and hundreds of PCA members, cheering for the winners during the festive presentation of the judging results on Sunday afternoon. Immediate Past President Steve Hoffman took home 2nd place in the very competitive Vintage category for his immaculate 1964 901. Jay Hall took home the "Best in Show" award and a free cruise with his classic 718 Spyder RSK model with ties to his personal 718 Boxster. Go Space Coast!

Our first two days at sea gave everyone a great introduction and preview of the special PCA events that had been planned for the week, including Meet the Expert sessions, Culinary Demos, After Hours Dance and Music extravaganzas, Formal Dinners, Singers, Dancers, Comedians, Movies and Parties on the Lido Deck. PCA members were everywhere. These events afforded all of us an opportunity to renew many old friendships, while making many new friends along the way.

Once in St. Maarten, members enjoyed browsing through the shops (trinkets to diamonds), sitting on the beach chairs made available by industrious locals, and of course eating and drinking. It was fun bumping into PCA members on every corner of the island. The locals were very friendly and our membership did the Porsche brand proud while visiting the island. Later that afternoon, we set sail for St. Kitts!



St. Kitts is another beautiful Caribbean Island that hosted some very exciting excursions...from Jeep tours to the St. Kitts Scenic Railway. Becke and I opted for the 18-mile rail tour through the interior of the island and along the coast. We saw old sugar plantations and countless waving locals along the way, with several high railroad trestles we had to cross...adding a certain unexpected thrill element to the journey by virtue of the aging narrow-gauge rails and the wobbliest train ride you could ever imagine. Once back on board, we set sail for San Juan, Puerto Rico, waving goodbye to the friendly people of St. Kitts.



Sailing into San Juan Puerto Rico early on the morning of December 15th was beautiful, passing old forts and new high rises as we entered the harbor. San Juan looks more like a metropolis than a quiet Caribbean Island, but features the same friendly local hospitality. Speaking of locals, thanks to the Puerto Rico region for arranging the "Wheels & Espresso" event right at the port for everyone to enjoy. It was nice to meet our Puerto Rican fellow-members and see some of their beautiful Porsches. Shortly after departure on our way to Grand Turk, our second formal Porsche dinner was held as we sailed into the sunset.

We arrived in Grand Turk around lunch time, with PCA members ready to experience our last on-shore experience. Our travel companions, Kathy and Brian Lewis, went on the snorkeling excursion, reporting that it was one of the best experiences they had ever had. The dedicated Porsche Zone, near the end of the dock, afforded our members one last opportunity to take in the local hospitality, rum, sand and sun before returning to the ship for our day at sea and eventual return to Fort Lauderdale.

Our final day at sea was very relaxing, and our last night aboard featured an awesome Porsche wrap-up reception on the Lido Deck, featuring a recap of the week's activities on the jumbotron, a huge group photo (I can't wait to see it!), and an opportunity for everyone to sign the Porsche Club flag.

And, while I think every member was looking forward to getting home, I think most were also feeling a bit melancholy about the Zonefest at Sea event coming to an end. It was a week of wonderful memories that will last a lifetime, shared with old friends and new...with locals and the crew.

As we met for dinner one last time, I thought about the Porsche Club of America slogan, "It's not just the cars...it's the people". We're all accustomed to attending kaffeeklatsches, driving events, Zonefests, Treffens and Porsche Parades. At these events, it's pretty common

But at the inaugural Zonefest at Sea, we left our cars behind on the shore (well, our full-size cars at least). For this event, they were not the main focal point of all of our interaction. 

48 Hours at Sebring Autocross

I haven't autocrossed at Sebring in over 15 years. So when I saw on the PCA Zone 12 calendar that Gold Coast and Sun Coast PCA were hosting two autocross events and an autocross school as part of their 48 Hours at Sebring event the first weekend of February, I registered for all of them. Big thanks to Steve and Dottie Kidd of for leading a great event. Additionally, thanks to the instructors and others who helped make the weekend so much fun.



Friday afternoon was the autocross school. Now, some of you who know me may be thinking, Rick's not a novice, why would he be going to an autocross school? Why? Because, if you want to get faster, there's no substitute for seat time. And even better than seat time, is seat time with an instructor. There were only five drivers registered so I figured there would be plenty of good seat time. Little did I know that one of the instructors would be SCCA Nationals trophy winner, Kit Gauthier. When I realized who he was, I called "dib's" on him for my first few instructor rides.

The autocross school and the autocross events were held on the skid pad area just to the west of turn one of the racetrack. Because there were race cars and drivers education events happening on the Sebring



track, it was important to use the breaks between heats to teach the "classroom" portion of the school and be heard over the roaring engines. Fortunately, that part of the school was short and before long we were on our feet and on to the course walk. The way the school was structured, it flowed from walking the course, to working the course, to running the course. All the basics a novice could need were covered.

After the thorough course walk explaining how to approach each element of the course, it was time to get in our cars. First we all did a parade lap to see the course from in the car. Then we had instructors ride along as we began multiple course runs, getting progressively faster. These were run without timing to get a feel of the course and take pointers from our instructors. After several runs, the timing system was turned on and we got to see how we were doing for time. Unfortunately, there was a glitch and the timing system went down, but we kept running for quite a while. Finally, we had all had our fill and called it a day for the school. I would be back in the morning for the first of two autocross events.



The weather was cool on Saturday morning as I arrived for the morning autocross. There were only 26 registered, but that was okay as the event had to finish before noon. The next event started at 1:30. The course walk reveled a layout with tight technical sections connected with long areas for acceleration and braking. Additionally, there was a large spiral on the low traction skid pad portion of the pavement that proved quite challenging. There was also an element Steve Kidd called a "Key West Box" consisting of four cones forming the corners of a box with a cone in the middle. Which way you went around the cone in the middle, left or right, was optional. The way it was set up, left was slower, but right was very tight and you ran a higher chance of hitting a cone. I went right every time and yes, I hit cones on more than one run. We got six runs and I managed to get some clean runs. I finished well and was happy with my results.

In between the two autocross events, we were offered the chance to do a few parade laps of the Sebring track for a \$20 charity donation. I've never driven on the track at Sebring. Now my appetite has been wetted and I'm looking to sign up for a DE!

The afternoon autocross also had 26 entrants. The course was almost the same, but a few of the gates had been adjusted just enough to change things up. But that Key West Box was still there and I still managed to hit cones in it, and a few other places. I finally got some clean runs and finished with an acceptable time. Now to clean all those cone marks off my car!



The "Fun" group saw Carmen Devito take first place in class, second overall with a fast 57.601, followed by Ken Marshall, second in


class, 4th overall with a






Details of the cars are from the Rolling Sculpture book written by Ken Gross and David Rand 2023 for the Vero Art Museum Exhibit.

There were many many more beauties to see. The Rolling Sculpture Exhibit is a "must see" before these stunning motor cars return to their owners across the country on April 30, 2023!




Tech Spotlight Porsche Recommended EV Receptacle

Porsche recommends using a Hubbell brand receptacle HBL9450A. This is a commercial grade receptacle that can handle a continuous charging current of 40 Amps. There have been instances where cheaper receptacles have overheated and caught fire. I bought mine off of Amazon but they are available from electrical supply houses, NOT Lowe's. You will also need to buy a new cover since this receptacle is slightly larger in diameter than the cheaper receptacles. I bought a Pass & Seymour SS701 stainless metal cover from City Electric Supply. Here's the box:



Here is the front view of the receptacle:



Here is the rear view of the receptacle:




Notice that this receptacle uses hex screws to tighten down on the wires. The cheaper receptacles seem to use a straight blade screw driver.

If you are not comfortable working with electrical components please have a licensed electrician install this new receptacle.





2023 12 Hours of Sebring - The Good, the Bad and the Ugly

First held in 1952, March 18th of 2023 marked the 71st running of the 12 Hours of Sebring. This was the second race of the 2023 International Motor Sports Association (IMSA) season. Steve Tarr and I left Melbourne in our P-cars in the pre-dawn hours to arrive at the Sebring racetrack in time for the fan walk at 9:00 am, where we mingled with racing royalty (race team owners and drivers) and their cars on pit lane. The fan walk is always one of my favorite things to do when attending a professional race!



The good. Rain was forecasted for the weekend, but the weather turned out perfect. This contributed to what appeared to be a record crowd. There was also a very large starting grid of 53 cars across the five classes racing that day. Porsche was well represented with two Penske 963 prototypes in the new GTP class, one 911 GT3.R in the GTD Pro class, and five 911 GT3.R cars in the GTD class. Hopes were high that the Porsche prototypes would do better than they did at Rolex 24 at Daytona in January and that the 911's would make a good showing in their classes. Then the race began.



The bad. The race was a crash-fest from start to finish. A spin in turn 1 of lap 1 stranded a prototype mid-track as the GTD classes were rounding this turn for the start of their race. It was a miracle they missed hitting him. A crash near the end of the race determined the winner of the GTP class. In total there were twelve full-course cautions following wrecks, resulting in a race that ran almost four hours (3 hours, 51 minutes) of its twelve hours under caution.

The ugly. The two Porsche 963 prototypes were doing very well and in contention for podium finishes in the GTP class, maybe even winning overall, until a wreck in the last 20 minutes of the race destroyed them both at the same time! The Whelen Cadillac (itself damaged in a wreck earlier in the race) went from fourth place to first and eventually won the race. Very disappointing to say the least.



I know auto racing requires aggressive driving behavior and wrecks are going to happen, but this seemed excessive. When I was racing with Historic Sportscar Racing (HSR) in 2018 there was a rule called 13/13. If you caused damage to another car you were placed on 13 month probation. If in those 13 months you did so again, you lost your racing license for 13 months, effectively killing two seasons for points accumulation. We were all amateurs. But we did not wreck as often, or in as many avoidable ways, as I saw at Sebring. I won the championships that year because I accumulated the most points, not because my competition crashed-out.

Maybe IMSA needs to hand out driver penalties for causing crashes. Maybe they need to limit the size of the field where only more highly skilled drivers are allowed. I watch professional races to see the best drivers compete and win because of their driving skills and capabilities of their cars, not because of them just being the last one standing. The Pfaff Motorsport Porsche finished first in the GTD Pro class at Sebring based on driver skills and car capabilities.

I'll be watching the next IMSA race on April 14-15 from Long Beach and hope to see the Porsche 963 on the podium there.
