Acknowledgment and Special Thanks:

- O **Donna Edwards** was thanked for her efforts and hard work in organizing events.
- Leslie Sikorski was introduced as a special guest. She is our Zone !2 representative.
- The Porsche Club of America (PCA) consists of 149 regions across the United States and Canada, which are grouped into 14 zones.
- The local club is part of Zone 12, which covers all of Florida, parts of Alabama and Mississippi, and Puerto Rico.
- Zone 12 contains 11 regions and is the smallest geographical zone but is competing for third place in membership, with 17,000 primary members.
 The zone is very active, hosting major events like the Rolex, 12 Hours of Sebring, 48 Hours of Sebring, and Amelia Island.
- Zone 12 is in 3rd place for members. We have around 17,000 members in our Zone.

Special Presentation

Lindsay Mayer, Outreach and Volunteers for Florida Wildlife Hospital.

The Outreach and Volunteer Manager from the Florida Wildlife Hospital presented, accompanied by volunteers and several "education animals." The hospital is located on US-1, about a mile and a half south of the Pineda Causeway and is open every day to care for sick, injured, or orphaned native Florida wildlife. The facility operates on five acres with 22 staff members and over 100 volunteers. It receives no government funding and relies entirely on community support.

The hospital treated a record-breaking 7,000 animals last year and is on track to exceed 8,000 this year, representing over 200 different species.

Education Animals

Sriracha, the Red Rat Snake: Presented as a form of "free pest control" that eats mice and other pests. Their jaws can unhinge to eat prey much larger than their heads.

- **Carolina, the Florida Box Turtle:** This native box turtle is an education animal due to shell deformities caused by being improperly kept in water as a baby. She cannot right herself if she flips over and requires permanent human care.
- **Red-Shouldered Hawk:** This hawk is missing three of its four toes on its right foot, an injury believed to have been caused by fishing line in its nest as a baby. It is used to educate the public on the importance of picking up trash.

Common Reasons for Animal Admission

The most common reasons for animal admissions are human-caused.

 Vehicle Strikes: Gopher tortoises often seek shade under cars. The hospital promotes the slogan "check below before you go" to prevent accidents. Gopher tortoise burrows provide habitat for over 350 other species.

Attacks by Pets Keeping cats and dogs indoors or on a leash helps protect local wildlife.

- Window Collisions: Birds often fly into windows, mistaking reflections for trees. Using bird-safe stickers, blinds, or simply not cleaning windows can prevent these collisions.
- "Kidnappings": Well-meaning people often bring in healthy young animals, believing they are orphaned.

Baby rabbits are often left alone by their mother, who only visits twice a day to feed them.

Fledgling birds go through a stage where they are on the ground and cannot yet fly, which is a normal part of their development.

• The public is encouraged to call the hospital if they are ever unsure whether an animal needs help.

How to Support the Wildlife Hospital

The hospital is always looking for volunteers and has leadership opportunities open on its Board of Directors.

• Donations of old linens (towels, pillowcases) are needed for lining cages. the hospital recycles aluminum cans to raise money for food and medication. A rescue instruction sheet and an Amazon wish list (currently in need of green baby food) are available for those who wish to contribute supplies.
